Short-Term Therapy Success

ADMISSION & TREATMENT: Yolanda Montoya is a 75-year-old female admitted to Mission Nursing and Rehab on 8/9/2025 for physical therapy and occupational therapy services. Yolanda presented with decline in functional mobility, decreased strength, reduced activity tolerance, and impaired static and dynamic balance following a recent hospitalization for sepsis and metabolic encephalopathy.

Her initial PT assessment indicated impairments in bilateral lower extremity strength, activity tolerance, and balance affecting bed mobility, transfers, and ambulation. The occupational therapy evaluation revealed impairments in coordination, balance, and activity tolerance.

During the PT evaluation, Yolanda required contact guard assistance with bed mobility and transfers. She was able to ambulate 40 feet with walker. The OT evaluation indicated patient required supervision for grooming and hygiene, moderate assistance for bathing and toileting, minimal assistance for upper body dressing, and maximum assistance for lower body dressing.

AT DISCHARGE: Following her stay at our skilled nursing facility. Ms. Yolanda Montoya made significant improvements in physical therapy by achieving her goal of walking 300ft with a four-wheeled walker with supervision!

Additionally, she is now able to bathe with supervision and dress herself independently.

Strong and determined, Ms. Montoya was successfully discharged home to continue her

progress with home health therapy.
